- Approval of the minutes of the January 13, 2020 meeting and public hearing: Mr. Cavender made a motion to approve minutes as written, seconded by Ms. Cultice. Motion carried (8-0)
- New and Old Business
 - Mrs. Starkey asked board if we need to work on a permit application for solar panels and solar farms

 - ➤ Code Enforcement Officer, Robby Blodgett, was present and presented all of her violations and the standing of them and asked the board that since the Public Nuisance Ordinance has been approved if she can now pursue the one for Melvin Zeiters property that he lives on.
 - The board said to continue with what needs to be done.
 - Austin Walter, 8078 N Tecumseh Rd Walkerton, was present explain to the board why his burnt dwelling has not been removed and cleaned up. He explained that it was an arson and he doesn't want to compromise the evidence.
 - Mr. Crase stated that he called the Fire Marshall and the other people that were involved with the case and they said that the investigation is complete with the burnt dwelling, so there is no reason why the dwelling can't be removed and cleaned up even though the investigation is still ongoing.
 - After discussion by the board and Mr. Walter, Mr. Chaffins asked Mr. Walter when he thinks he will be able to remove the dwelling.
 - Mr. Walter stated that it will take a little time to get someone to remove it now
 - Mr. Crase made a motion to give Mr. Walter (60) sixty days to get the burnt dwelling removed and property cleaned up, seconded by Ms. Cultice. Motion carried (8-0)
