STARKE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' MEETING

12-16-24

Pursuant to adjournment comes now the Starke County Commissioners and meet in regular session in the meeting room of the Starke County Annex #1, Knox, IN at 9:30 AM, with all members present. Councilmen Todd Leinbach and Bruce Bennett were in attendance along with Councilman Dave Pearman via zoom and the following proceedings were held to wit:

IN RE: E-911 CONTRACTS AND INVOICES

Stacy Noonan, Head Dispatcher for 911, submitted quotes for a yearly service contract on equipment in the amount of \$26,016.00, a dispatch upgrade in the amount of \$73,192.00, a yearly contract on the fire simulcast system in the amount of \$14,340.00 and a 10-year system refresh on 911 phone max call in the amount of \$194,047.37. Charles Chesak moved to approve all of them with the contracts coming out of contracts in their budget and the dispatch upgrade out of ARPA and the refresh out of Cum. Cap. Funds seconded by Mark Gourley with 3 ayes.

IN RE: EMS

Nancy Coad submitted the reports of collections in the amount of \$114,460.76 and reports of collections from the collection agencies—Jonathan O'Hara-\$1,961.91 and Merchants and Medical in the amount of \$401.46.

James Garner submitted a report regarding their monthly operations. It is on file in the Auditor's Office and attached to these minutes.

IN RE: HOOSIER SOLAR

Nick Barbknecht and Martin Lucas asked if there were any questions on the updated EDAs they submitted. They had no questions, and Mark Gourley moved to approve seconded by Don Binkley with 2 ayes 1 nay (Charles Chesak).

IN RE: APPOINTMENTS TO THE COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS BOARD

Shawn Mattraw requested that the commissioners appoint Auditor, Michaelene J. Houston as the financial representative and Marlene Patrick as a Lay Person for 2025. Charles Chesak moved to approve seconded by Mark Gourley with 3 ayes.

IN RE: ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CONTRACT

Mikie Stogsdill (via zoom) and Janice Hernandez submitted the new Economic Development contract and submitted a report on what they are doing. They are asking for a \$40,000 increase on the contract, but everything else remains the same. The new contract amount would be \$130,000. Charles Chesak stated that he would like to see some success before approving the

increase. Mark Gourley moved to table until January or February to give Charles a chance to discuss things with Mikie seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

IN RE: HIGHWAY

Rachel Oesterreich submitted her monthly report of operations. It is on file in the Auditor's Office and attached to these minutes.

Rachel is requesting permission to purchase a vehicle for signage. She stated she has the money in her budget. Both vehicles found are attached. Mark Gourley moved to approve purchasing a vehicle for up to \$20,000 seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

Rachel also requested permission to purchase culverts. She stated she has the money for that in her Cum. Bridge budget. Quotes are attached. Mark Gourley moved to approve culverts in the amount of \$18,619.50 seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

Rachel submitted a report on Bridge #137. The county's portion of the bridge will be \$969,942.22. Full report on file in the Auditor's Office and attached.

Bridge #13 over the Robbins ditch has a county share of \$353,000. In order to apply for the grant, she needs a signed letter stating that the county accepts the financial obligation regarding replacement of the bridge. Mark Gourley moved to approve seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

IDEM came to the highway and submitted a final report regarding possible oil contamination. Victoria Chessor, EMA director, stated that the compliance report from IDEM states that the matter is closed. The report is on file in the Auditor's Office and attached.

Rachel stated that her requests for equipment were turned down by the council because they would prefer she used pug and the commissioners want her to use hot mix.

IN RE: NORTH JUDSON/WAYNE TOWNSHIP FIRE DEPARTMENT

Todd Jackson, Fire Chief, requested radios due to being outdated. He submitted a report on the status of the radios and is asking for approval in ARPA for \$5,000 already approved plus an additional \$14,029.76. The Town of North Judson didn't approve any extra money for this. Info attached. Todd further stated that there are no communications grants available. Mark Gourley moved to approve the \$19,029.76 contingent on Dunns' Bridge EDA approval by the council seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

IN RE: SHERIFF/JAIL

April Wilhelm requested 2 gas cards for when officers have to transfer prisoners. They normally get their fuel from the county, but when they do a transfer, they sometimes need more fuel. They generally only have one transfer at a time, but would like a 2nd card as backup. She stated that she is making a sign in/out sheet and that the cards will be locked up when not in use.

Mark Gourley moved to approve as long as the cards are locked up and a sign out sheet used to protect the safety of the cards seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

April stated that they have an officer who is requesting her work weeks be 80 hours in a two-week period instead of 84. This would mean time and a half would begin after 80 hours for just the one officer. Justin Schramm stated that he would look into this and report back.

IN RE: CORONER'S ADDITION

April Wilhelm, Coroner, submitted quotes for the addition and the storm damage repairs. She has \$50,000 that was designated to her from ARPA. She also has 3 quotes for coolers. She prefers the walk in cooler as she is thinking of long-term answers for what's out there. Both total \$71,095.75. Mark Gourley moved to approve with the \$50,000 out of ARPA and the other \$21,095.75 out of Cum. Capital Development and pending verification that the contractor is licensed and registered. Charles Chesak seconded his motion with 3 ayes. Quotes are attached.

IN RE: PARK BOARD FUNDRAISER

Amie Flora requested permission to do a fundraiser for the Park Department. It would consist of T-shirts, sweatshirts, polos, totes, etc. They would all have the park's logo on them. Mark Gourley moved to approve seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

IN RE: MAMMOTH SOLAR

Chris Shelmon Attorney for Mammoth and Chris Neff with Mammoth reported that they have achieved the 1st phase and met their obligations. They stated that they made a payment to the county on Friday in the amount of \$100,000. They also gave a report on the progress and changes to the EDA. The revised EDA is proposing pre-payments that will reflect against the agreement. It will be deducted later but this will give the county \$400,000 in early cash flow. Chris Shelmon sent Justin Schramm a revised copy of the EDA during the meeting via email, and Justin has not a chance to look it over yet. Mark Gourley moved to table this for further review of the restructuring of payments seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

IN RE: STARKE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

Kathy Norem, President of the Hospital Board, informed the commissioners that the lease had been sold to Community Health Systems and they are nearing the end of the 1st lease agreement. She needs approval by January of 2026 and would like some changes. She would like a community survey and would like to create a committee consisting of one commissioner, 3 council and 3 hospital board members.

Kathy also requested an appropriation of \$50,000 for a consultant/attorney and community needs. Mark Gourley suggested using the Public Health Fund. Mark Gourley moved to approve the request for \$50,000 from the non-reverting Public Health Fund seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

Mark Gourley moved to appoint Charles Chesak to the Hospital Committee seconded by Don Binkley with 3 ayes.

IN RE: CLAIMS, PAYROLL AND MINUTES

Charles Chesak moved to approve the claims seconded by Mark Gourley with 3 ayes.

Mark Gourley moved to approve the payroll seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

Charles Chesak moved to approve the 12-2-24 minutes seconded by Mark Gourley with 3 ayes.

IN RE: EMA

Don Binkley stated that he had received complaints about the EMA office being relocated to the highway department. He called the state and was told it could be located in any county owned building.

IN RE: SURVEYOR

Tom Schouten, Surveyor, stated that a job was done by the four-county drainage board that was not authorized by the Surveyor. The job is already completed and the contractor did not get approval from the Surveyor. Tom also stated that they would have needed permission from the DNR to dig. Tom stated that he is not paying the bill and that Justin Schramm had told him he needed to let the commissioners know what was going on. The board does not have the authority to expand a contract, but Ed Jernas authorized the 550 foot expansion and did not have the authority to do so. He stated that Ed is on the four-county drainage board. Justin Schramm stated that it was not authorized by the majority of the board and the contractor moved forward anyway. Mark Gourley moved to table the claim because the work was not authorized seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes. Charles Chesak who is also on the four-county drainage board is going to check into this matter.

IN RE: FUTURE SOLAR MORATORIUM

Don Binkley moved to put a moratorium for one year on any new solar companies coming in. This would exclude Mammoth, Next Era and Hoosier as they are already here. Charles Chesak seconded the motion with 2 ayes 1 nay (Mark Gourley).

IN RE: HIGHWAY-PUG VS HOT MIX

Bruce Bennett, Councilman, asked if Don Binkley had stated that the highway could no longer use Pug Mix. Bruce also asked if it was brought up in a public meeting and voted on. A heated debate ensued about pug vs hot mix and the authority to make the decision.

IN RE: BASS LAKE BEACH

It was discussed about a lease agreement for a section of the beach in order to put in an extra pump. Agreements have not yet been drawn up.

IN RE: PUBLIC COMMENT

Larry Wickert stated that these meetings are not the	place to have heated debates.
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There being no further business to come before the board, Mark Gourley moved to adjourn seconded by Charles Chesak with 3 ayes.

Starke County EMS Monthly Report December 2024 for November

Operations: Currently we continue operating 4 out of 6 ambulances 1 at ALS level 100% operating with full time Paramedic chase car staffed daily, 1 Paramedic/EMS Director car running as a backup as well. 1 Transfer truck also when available as an additional Ambulance when not doing transfers. Minimum of 1 ALS staff member at all times scheduled currently between chase car and Knox base, compared to November staffing staffing of 2 or more ALS staffed ambulances 67% which is an decrease of coverage from 84%. due to loss of staff.

Transfers: 41 As of last monthly report in November. We also have been promoting and currently working on more.

Personnel: We have at this time one full-time opening for EMT's with 2 applications on waiting list, 2 new part-time EMR/Driver's hired for the transfer truck along with 1 part time Paramedic. Currently have 3 fulltime paramedic openings due to going Ambulance for higher wages, 10 part-time paramedics with 4 who had left for various reasons. 2 on extended leave for medical reasons

December 2024 Monthly Highway Report

Winter Operations

We are moving into our winter operations for the season. Mother nature is definitely throwing colder weather and snow at us earlier than last year. We are ready for whatever she brings our way. The trucks have been winterized and we have the salt shed loaded and ready to go. We also have an extra stock pile of salt that is ready to be mixed when needed. While we are waiting for the plowing season to begin we have begun working on building the new road on 800 E. S/O Toto Road. It is progressing nicely, but will take some time to be completed. As well as the new construction of this roadway the drivers have been out in their areas keeping up with patching, wash-outs, and brush clean up.

Sign Man Vehicle Purchase Request

Last winter the ambulance that the sign man used had been taken out of operations due to transmission failure and other issues that were going on. That was an old ambulance that we received retired from the EMS Department many years ago. Since then, the sign man has been working out of a pick-up truck. I would like to get that pick-up back in our normal fleet for daily operations and purchase a used ambulance for the sign man to start using again. I have two quotes for you to review. I am not asking for any additional funding; this purchase would come from my LRS appropriation from budget year 2025.

Culvert Purchase

I would like to purchase culverts and with the \$10,000 restriction on purchases the highway department has I will need to get approval for that purchase. We are getting our inventory ready for culvert replacements in 2025 and I have a few sizes in which I only have one or two pipes lefts. I would like to purchase 36" and 48" culverts to stockpile for the start of the season in the spring. I have brought a quote from Debco for you to review which will be presented tonight at the council meeting as well.

When we applied for the bridge construction in 2018 we were awarded 1.2 Million in Federal funds. You can receive additional local funds if they are available at the time of construction. This can vary from year to year as to what is available due to other projects and inflation. Our bridge went to letting and bid were open 12/11/2024. INDOT does the bid opening and makes their recommendations on the lowest bidder. We received that letter on 12/11/2024. Superior Construction Co. Inc. came in as the lowest bidder at \$2,169,942.22. At this time INDOT does not have any extra local funding to put towards this project. The counties remaining portion will be \$969,942.22. We will need to send back the Recommendation letter for this company to proceed with the project. At the time of sending this letter to INDOT there is no extra local funding available. That's not to say it couldn't change between now and then. INDOT just wants us to be aware of what we may need to pay if funds aren't available before we proceed forward with the project. Purpose for the project (Explain the deficiency of the pavement if this is a pavement project)

The purpose of this project is to replace and widen the bridge. Three elements are rated 5 or less and are deteriorating rapidly based on recent inspection reports.

The Substructure is rated a 4 and the Deck and Superstructure are rated at a 5. The deck is also not wide enough to accommodate the truck traffic that uses 300E to enter the industrial park.

The Substructure is in poor condition and deteriorating rapidly. The piles are exposed, rebar is rusted, and the concrete is generally deteriorating.

Republic dumpsters. Ms. Chessor forwarded IDEM staff the waste manifest for the final load of sand disposal (See attached documents). After the sand had been removed, the facility laid gravel down along the north and east side of the pug mix pile (See Photo Log – photos 3, 4, and 5). Ms. Chessor informed IDEM staff that the hole dug on the east side of the pug mix pile from removing a fluid release near the hookup pipe on the pug mixing machine had been filled with sand and gravel.

The pug mix pile was smaller than what was observed during the October 15, 2024, follow-up inspection as the facility is using the mix on the roads. As of now, the facility is importing pug mix and placing it in a pile east of the old pug mix pile. In the center of the smaller pug mix pile is a puddle of rainwater from the recent weather event (photo 2). Ms. Chessor informed IDEM staff that the area west of the pug mix pile had been cleaned up as well (photo 1).

IDEM staff inspected the northwest side of the property to observe the booms in the ditch (*photos 6 and 7*). The facility stated to IDEM staff that they still have not observed any oil in the booms and will change them as necessary. The water in the ditch appeared to be transparent with no oily sheen.

For future reference, to report an environmental emergency, call IDEM's 24-Hour Emergency Spill Line toll free at (888) 233-7745 or (317) 233-7745. All spills require a spill response, regardless of reportability. The inspection ended with an exit interview.


CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Violations regarding improper fluid management are being returned to compliance. IDEM recommends continuing housekeeping practices.

Note (10-15-24): IDEM staff observed the fluid release north of the pug mix machine to be dug out and sand placed in the water accumulated around the pug asphalt pile for absorption.

Required Action: Immediately clean-up, remove, and contain all spills and contaminated soil/debris resulting from spills and releases. Remove at least six (6) inches below visible contamination. Dispose of all waste and contaminated soil/debris in a state permitted municipal solid waste landfill. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter, submit a written response to IDEM, documenting proper disposal of the remediated waste as well as plans to prevent future contamination.

Status Update: RETURNED TO COMPLIANCE. The facility has remediated the fluid release observed during the September 3, 2024, complaint inspection.





Regarding: Funding request to purchase 8 new 7/800MHz radios

Request: \$19,029.76

North Judson Wayne Township Volunteer Fire Dept. is requesting \$19,029.76 to purchase 8 new EF Johnson/Kenwood VP5430 handheld 7/800MHz Radios.

NJFD's current radio inventory consist of the 8 Motorola radios from the EMA grant the county received several years ago. The rest of our inventory consist of 23 Motorola XTS5000 radios. 4 of these radios are not operable and are used as parts radios to keep the rest of the radios semi-operational. 17 of our firefighters are using these radios and we keep the remaining 2 spare radios at the station in case someone needs to grab a radio as they run out of the station to respond to a call.

The Motorola XTS5000 radios were commercially released in 2004. They were expected to have a 12-year market life but were discontinued after only 9 years in 2013. The last software/firmware update to support these radios was released in 2006. Replacement/repair parts were produced for these radios for 5 years and discontinued in 2018. NJFD has not been able to have any of these radios repaired in the last several years do to not being able to find parts.

NJFD's current radio budget from the Town of North Judson is not enough to purchase even 1 radio during the year. As with most government entities, unused funds are not able to be rolled over into a new year. NJFD uses the radio budget we receive to keep the VFH pagers our firefighters all carry updated to current software, operational and occasionally we have to purchase a new pager if one breaks or is damaged. These funds are also used to keep all our truck radios updated and operational.

NJFD has been applying for grants when we can but have not been successful as radio grants rarely come available. We would like to move to updated, more modern radios but funding to do so is not available.

If supported and approved by Starke County Commissioners and Starke County Council, NJFD would immediately order the new radios from Bartronics, Inc. out of Chesterton, IN. NJFD would also use the \$5,000 that was approved by the county earlier in 2024 to purchase an additional 2 radios for a total of 10 new radios. Bartronics would receive the radios and program them to the county's current programming platform. NJFD would hope to have these new radios in house and in service by the end of 2024 or very early in 2025. This will allow NJFD to replace 10 of the worst condition radios that our firefighters are currently carrying.

Thank you for your time, consideration and support of the Firefighters of Starke County and the North Judson Wayne Township Volunteer Fire Dept.
